Summary of results and key findings

Results at a glance



- Key fact 1: A majority of people is convinced that Malaysia is producing its timber sustainably. No other tropical country in the world comes even close to that
- Key fact 2: 38 per cent of German timber traders see a growing demand for certified timber
- Key fact 3: German window producers see larch as the greatest competitor to tropical timber
- Key fact 4: 80 per cent of German architects consider timber a suitable construction material

Executive summary



- The survey, conducted in May and June 2015, provides a comprehensive overview of the perception of tropical timber and certification schemes among relevant target groups in the German timber industry.
- Overall, Malaysia is considered the most sustainable producer of tropical timber and PEFC is increasingly becoming more recognized as an acceptable certification scheme.
- Demand for tropical timber overall is slightly decreasing, caused by the emergence of alternative products as well as the trend of using locally sourced timber (pine, spruce, larch). Certified timber, however, is in high demand.
- More efforts need to be taken to highlight that sustainable forestry is the best strategy for the protection of tropical forests all over the world.
- PEFC as a certification scheme for tropical forests was able to increase its brand awareness over the last years, largely due to the positive image of MTCC and the impact Malaysian sustainability efforts had on public opinion.

Survey design



- Online questionnaire, link sent via email
- Four target groups
 - Timber traders and importers
 - Window producers
 - Architects
 - Public Procurement departments
- The questionnaires were designed to offer opportunities of comparing results across groups. Some questions were adapted to fit the target groups, some were exclusively used for specific target groups
- Crude data was analyzed and edited by KaiserCommunication for this summary




Results Timber Traders / Importers



What is the percentage of tropical timber from Southeast Asia in the total mix of wood in your company?






The share of Southeast Asian timber averages around 28 per cent.

What is the percentage of tropical timber from Malaysia in the total mix of tropical wood in your company?






Malaysian timber holds a share of on average more than 50 per cent of all tropical timber available.

How has the demand for tropical timber among window producers developed over the past two years?






According to traders, modified timbers (Accoya) and local species (including larch) are main competitors to Malaysian timber.




How do you estimate the development of the demand for certified tropical timber?

Did the development of demand correlate with the implementation of EUTR?




EUTR implementation had a positive impact on the demand for certified tropical timber.




Share of certification schemes in timber stock (globally sourced)



Traders stock greater quantities of PEFC timber than FSC timber.


Over the last two years, how do you evaluate the development of the demand for PEFC timber compared to FSC?

The reputation of African producers remains very negative.



How has the application of tropical timber in the window sector developed over the last two years?








Of all the Asian timber you use: What is the share of timber from Malaysia?






Some window producers are highly specialized on Malaysian timber.

Which Malaysian species do you use?






Dark Red Meranti is the major species from Malaysia, e.g. for windows and doors, in Germany.

Do you consider the following materials to be relevant market competitors to tropical timber from Malaysia?






According to window manufacturers, alternative materials and larch are main competitors to Meranti windows.


PEFC-certified window frames

Do PEFC-certified window frames sell better than products without certification?




A large share of window producers do not see a direct financial benefit from certification and complain that the revenue derived from using certified timber is still not motivating large-scale change.

PEFC vs. FSC




Products with which of the two major certifications do you use more often?




Clients still seem to prefer FSC-certified products on average.

Which of the following tropical countries do you link with the concept of Sustainable Forest Management?





Timber as construction material




Do you consider timber a suitable material for window and door frames?



About 80 per cent of architects consider timber a suitable construction material. There is a rising recognition for the value of certification.


How large is the share of timber-based materials, e.g. windows/doors, in your various construction projects?





Do you regularly consider using certified tropical timber in your designs?




The majority of architects generally recommend the use of timber from producing countries.






For what purposes is the procured timber used?






Municipalities have little data so far, procurement of renewable resources is a growing issue in Germany.

Most of the timber is used in the construction and renovation sector.



Do you have special requirements for the procurement of tropical timber?




26 per cent of all public procurement officers are generally skeptical of buying tropical timber.




Do you consider yourself to be well-informed on the certification of tropical timber?

Responses by the participants:

- German manufacturers along the CoC are not certified
- Negative media coverage puts decision-makers under pressure to refrain from arguing in favor of tropical timber in public debates and NGO dialogues
- Increased supply of domestic products & local sourcing initiatives
- Rising availability of recycling alternatives
- Low level trust in the certificates and authorities in producing countries




Comparative analysis

In order to achieve the best possible results, those target groups representing trade and industry as well as those target groups representing market and consumer demands are used for comparison.


Demand for tropical timber






Demand for certified tropical timber




Different groups within the market perceive different products as their competitors.

The German CoC consider Malaysia as the only relevant player in SFM in the tropics.





- MTCS is the flagship for PEFC in the tropics
- Group certification of CoC sectors grows significantly
- The industry and also end consumers (homeowners) ask increasingly for certified materials
- German stakeholders continue to view Malaysia as a forerunner in sustainable forest management
- Other materials and local species increase the competitiveness of the market for Malaysian products
- Certified tropical timber is a growing market

"You have the best product, but price and acceptance is challenging!" "We need more information and promotion to convince the end consumer that PEFC-certified tropical timber is worth buying."

"Tropical timber lasts longer and therefore is automatically more sustainable."

"Political influence is of key importance to improve the demand for certified tropical timber." "The whole CoC needs to be certified. Often procurement fails because joineries are not certified."
